Dr. Schwartz has cared for women with gynecological malignancies at Yale for over 40 years, and has a continued research interest into biomarkers for the earlier detection of ovarian cancer. He is a member of the Yale Cancer Center Cancer Genetics and Genomics Research Program and the Smilow Cancer Hospital Gynecologic Oncology Program. His clinical research focus is on the use of neoadjuvant therapy for ovarian cancer and aggressive uterine cancer and he was the first to propose the use of tamoxifen for ovarian cancer treatment. Dr. Schwartz has consistently advocated for a multidisciplinary approach to cancer care and treatment and has made education a priority throughout his tenure at Yale School of Medicine, establishing the fellowship in gynecologic oncology in 1979.
